Early Care and Education Program



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What is First4ME?

- A two-generation, community focused framework for a coordinated birth to kindergarten-entry program by providing quality early care and education to promote a healthy, positive transition to kindergarten for children and families.
- First4ME was included in <u>LD 1712 (2021)</u> "An Act to Support Children's Healthy <u>Development and School Success."</u>
- The program funds community contractors to convene efforts to provide intensive support to Child Care Providers (CCP), School Districts (SAU's), the family and the child with a focus on families that have or are experiencing hardship.
- Highlights the benefits of an efficient system of coordinated resources for all stakeholders and how high-quality child care can support a strong workforce in the short and long term.



Elevate Maine

History

Elevate Maine is an initiative that is facilitated by KVCAP/Educare in Somerset County. A comprehensive service model including support to providers and community interaction. An evaluation report came out in July 2020 indicating positive outcomes for children and families <u>Elevate Maine 2020 Report linked here</u>. This is considered the demonstration model.




In the 2021 Legislative Session, LD 1712: An Act to Support Children's Healthy Development and School Success was enacted as Section 2 22 M.R.S.A §1065. This is our guiding framework for the pilot. Funded through the Federal Child Care Block Grant (CCDF)



With consultation from KVCAP, the Office of Child and Family Services built the pilot's goals and scope. This pilot is to pressure test the framework created through a third party evaluation and feedback from providers, families, schools and community members impacted by the pilot to inform future OCFS programs and support

Implementation Sites



First4ME Components

- 1.Non-Profit serve as the convenor of program efforts and fiscal oversight
- 2. Coalition with diverse membership for community engagement
- 3. Community Coach(es) to drive:
 - Support to child care providers
 - Service access to families
 - •School District (SAU) and Community Provider communication
 - System alignment and coordination



- 5. Early Screening and Intervention to support Kindergarten entry transition success
- 6. Two Generational Approach to engage families for consistent support across all settings
- 7. State level technical assistance and coordination to support coaches and quality assurance






Kindergarten Success (Transitions)

First4ME Goals



- Increase successful early learning transitions for children regardless of risk factors leading into kindergarten entry
- 2. Increase sustained, high-quality child care and early childhood education across the mixed delivery system
- 3. Develop a coordinated system of support both statewide and local for families, providers, schools, and communities
- 4. Strengthen the consistent continuity of care for families birth to school aged with community support to all participants

Role of Starting Strong



- Starting Strong will be an early childhood hub of support for Portland
- Starting Strong is the grantee, facilitating a Community Coalition
- Starting Strong will hire and/or contract with staff to support children, families, and child care programs in Portland
- Starting Strong will receive the grant funds and disseminate funds and stipends to child care programs who participate in the project and contract with them

First4ME Structure

Four key participants

- Child: a child that meets at-risk criteria, who is enrolled in a child care program that is contracting with Starting Strong
- Family: the parent(s), legal guardian(s), or authorized caregiver(s) of the child
- Provider: licensed child care (family child care or center-based) who contracts with Starting Strong
- Local School Administrative Units (SAUs): Portland Public Schools

First4ME Eligibility

"At-Risk" child/family

The child (participant) or a family member within the home with one or more of the following:

 economically disadvantaged (not exceeding 185% of Federal poverty level), child welfare involvement or past involvement, in foster care, experiencing homelessness, exposed to substance use disorder, identified as special needs, has a physical or mental disability, and/or a person with limited English proficiency.

First4ME Portland Goals




- Inclusive of the diversity of Portland's families with specific supports for multilingual families and immigrant/refugee/asylum seeker families
- Inclusive of the variety of early care and education programming with program components for family child care programs and child care centers
- Selection of child care program partners will prioritize strategies to maximize the number of at-risk children served by First4ME

First4ME Portland Goals

- Increase publicly-funded PreK partnerships between Portland Public schools and licensed child care programs and Head Start
- Begin public PreK partnerships with new partners, multilingual programs, those currently at QRIS 1, 2, & 3, and family child care programs (may take some innovation, policy changes, and/or provisional partnerships to start)
- Focus on shared services such as group health insurance, a substitute pool, and a broader hub of support for Portland child care programs
- Focus on ECE workforce retention and development


